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


















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Well done to all the children for working so hard to receive house points this term. Each week was a closely run competition and the final totals were also very close.

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

Read Write Inc - Phonics



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It's never too early to start learning phonics – Mrs Barugh and Fred are very busy already working on phonics with Millie Barugh (who is not even a month yet!).

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This week all children in Year 1 and Year 2 who are still working on the RWInc programme brought home a sheet of speedy reading words relating to the colour they are currently working on.

We have been carrying out assessments this week and feel that speedy reading – reading words at a glance is a key focus for a large proportion of the children. The words on the list that have been sent home are words that the children should be very fluent with and be able to read at a glance. It would be really beneficial for the children to work on these words over the Christmas holiday to improve their overall reading fluency.
