
ST JOSEPH 6 SYMPHONY



CAFOD

This term, our K\$1 children were visited by CAFOD and took part in a session about how some countries around the world lack basic necessities that many of us take for granted. They learnt about CAFOD's Cancel Debt, Choose Hope campaign and reflected on the importance of fairness and compassion.

At St Joseph's we had our Pledge Day. KS1 have promised to make regular visits to our local care home, bringing joy and companionship to the residents, while KS2 will be supporting vulnerable children at Udayan, a home in India providing care and education for children affected by leprosy. Through these acts, our children are truly learning what it means to be global citizens and compassionate members of their community.













Year 1-6 students visited the church for a special time of Adoration. Father John helped them to understand that Jesus is truly present in the Eucharist. The children had time to spend in silence, an important opportunity to talk to Jesus in their hearts. Each class also visited the oratory, which gave them a peaceful space to reflect.

During the month of May, we honoured and remembered Mary in a special way. As a whole school, we came together to celebrate her with love and reverence. We watched as the statue of Mary was processed through the school, creating a peaceful and prayerful moment for everyone. Every child made a beautiful flower, and these were placed around Mary, decorating her with colour and care. It was a lovely way to show our devotion and to remember Mary's importance in our faith.
