Saint Martin Porres was a Peruvian lay brother.

When he was a little boy he lived with his mother and his sister but they were very poor.

Martin would spend hours every night praying.

When he was 15 he wanted to join a monastery but under Peruvian law he wasn't allowed as his his family were from Africa. He asked The Dominicans of Holy Rosary Priory in Lima to accept him as a "donado", a volunteer who performed menial tasks in the monastery in return for the privilege of wearing the habit and living with the religious community.



Martin was a kind and caring young man who liked to look after other people.

After 8 years at the Holy Rosary, the head Prior decided to ignore the law and let Martin take his vows as a member of the Third Order of Saint Dominic.

Unfortunately, not everyone was happy with this decision and some of the priests were very mean to Martin!




Martin was a wonderful kind and caring man.

He would feed the poor, usually feeding 160 poor people every day!

He loved children and established an orphanage and a children's hospital.

Martin also loved animals and was even said to be able to talk to animals!



St. Martin performed many miracles including healing very sick people.

When he died on 3rd November 1639 he had earned the love and respect of his fellow Dominicans as well as the people who lived outside the monastery.



Saint Josephine Bakhita Reception





Saint Josephine Bakhita was a Sudanese religious sister.

When she was a little girl she lived in Sudan, Africa with her family and was very happy.

When she was 7 years old she was taken from her family and forced to be a slave.

She was treated very badly and was very unhappy.



12 years later she was sold to an Italian family who treated her with more kindness.

The Italian family had to go back to Sudan for business so left Josephine with the Canossian Sisters (nuns) in Venice.

There Josephine was taught about God and His love for her.

On 29 November 1889, an Italian court ruled that Josephine should never have been a slave and her freedom was granted.



Josephine decided to stay with the nuns and was baptised, received Holy Communion and was confirmed on 9th January 1890.

Over the next 42 years, Josephine served God and was a kind, helpful and cheerful person.



Because she was such a kind and holy person, Josephine was canonized as Saint Josephine Bakhita on 1st October 2000.

Saint Josephine Bakhita's feast day is 8th February.




Saint Clare




St Clare was born on the 16th July 1194 in Assisi Italy. Her Feast Day is the 11th of August.

There, Clare traded her rich clothing for simple habit and veil, and after singing and praying, St Francis cut off Clare's long, beautiful hair as a symbol of her commitment to a new way of life.



2S - St Augustine




Saint Augustine



He said that before you can teach others about God, you must first fill yourself with God yourself, and you can do this by praying.






