

It really is a privilege to be a part of this group and to be a Head Pupil. If you ever get the chance to go for a position like this I recommend you taking it because it really is extraordinary.




Harvey—Head Pupil

My name is Darcey Hassett and I am a Prefect in the Pupil Leadership Team.


In my free time, I love to act, dance and sing. My favourite subject is Art as I get to explore my creative side.
