Playground Play Equipment

Please ensure that your child remains with you whilst on the school premises, at drop off and pick up times. Children are not allowed to mount the play equipment, trim trails or the gym at the start or the end of the day.

Your child has been reminded of this in assembly but please speak to your child so that this message can be reinforced at home.

Lost uniform

A number of parents have expressed concern that lost items are not being re-united with their owners. Please check the school uniform you have at home to ensure your child has not brought items home by mistake.

Every effort is made to ensure items are returned to children and this is made so much easier when EVERY item is clearly named.

Drop off

Despite reminders, children are still being left unattended at the school gates from eight o'clock

onwards. The school gates do not open until 8.30am and pupils must not be left unsupervised prior to this time.

Vehicles must not drive up the wrong side of the road.

No vehicle should enter the school grounds until after 8.30am. Parents must not park unless they have a blue badge or prior permission from the Headteacher.

Additionally, if your child is late for school you are expected to park outside of the school gates and accompany your child to the school office to sign in.

School staff have been reminded that they are not permitted to open the school gates for parents arriving late.

Please work with us to ensure that we all safeguard the children and do not leave them vulnerable.

Read Write Inc



Children in Years 1-2 have now been re-assessed and re-grouped for the remainder of the Advent Term. You will have received a letter in the book bag to indicate the group level that your child is working at. In order to progress through the scheme children need to develop a range of reading skills: not only recognition of letter sounds (indicated in the letter for their group), but also the ability to blend these sounds into words confidently, read words speedily and have a sound grasp of red (not decodable words for the level they are working at) words. At the higher levels of the scheme children need to be able to read passages fluently with prosody and speed while gaining meaning from the text.

After working on a book for three sessions in school—the book that has been read will go home in the book bag, along with a an unfamiliar book at the same level. Both of these books should be read daily at home—the same book will go home daily for a number of days and the idea is that this should be a fluent and easy read for the child. Overlearning and over exposure is a key part of this programme and a key part of securing phonic knowledge, so please do not be put off by thinking the children should have books they struggle with. They will be learning the next set of sounds in school—getting ready to move to the next colour. Please make sure that after reading at home you return the book bag to their school bag as we will capitalise on as much time as possible to read with the children in school time. In addition to the RWInc books the children will have a reading for pleasure library book to share with you. The idea is that you read this book to them—so they develop a love of story and have the opportunity to listen to competent readers reading to them, to develop their ability to read with expression, intonation and hear stories with a 'story teller voice'. Please read other books you have at home or from the library with them in addition to this—and record all reading in the reading record. There should be a record

of reading in there daily.

Once a three- day cycle has been completed books will be changed. Please allow that there are times where different activities take place in school, e.g. special assemblies, Masses, visits etc and this may mean that the RWInc sessions are slightly knocked out and hence it might be that the books are not changed until a fourth day. It is important that the children also have these additional experiences.

We will move the children onto the next level at the appropriate time for them and do spend the time looking at each assessment and each child, ensuring that the group they go into is the correct group. If rapid progress is seen we do re-test some individuals mid cycle and adjust these groups and do not wait for the next assessment point. Phonics is not a race to reach the end of the programme but rather it is vital to secure this knowledge at this early stage of education for each child, so that they have very firm foundations on which to build their reading and are able to access the wider curriculum which is so dependent on good reading skills.
