


Gospel Reading for

Matthew 21: 28-32



Headteacher's message

The Gospel reading this week (The Parable of the Vineyard Workers, Matthew 20: 1-16) focused

upon a phrase that I have heard many times throughout my teaching career and my role as a parent—"It's not fair!" Imagine working a whole day and being paid the same as someone who worked only a few hours—was this fair? The workers did not think so, but Jesus reminds us that we must not compare ourselves to others. God does not compare us to each other, but instead offers us endless and abounding love! Sometimes we can question why something has happened to us, or why things don't go our way, but we shouldn't—God has a plan and knows why things happen as they do. We need to have faith. He is just and fair and just like the landowner in the Gospel, he will call us every day, every hour, until we are ready to come to Him. We thought about this carefully and reflected that we can grow closer to Him through prayer, sharing His word, and receiving the Sacraments. Our God is a good God and we are all thankful for this. Please spend some time at the weekend talking with your child about things that they are thankful for and giving thanks for the blessings that are bestowed upon us all.



Firstly, I would like to thank all those parents who attended the RWI workshops on Thursday evening. In the first session, Mrs Barugh went through the programme and discussed the ways in which you can help your child at home. We know that the foundation for learning comes from reading—reading can open the door to many new worlds. Miss Whelan led the second session for parents, explaining the process once the RWI programme has been completed. We hope that both sessions have equipped those parents who attended to support the development of reading skills for their children.
