Topic:

We are continuing our mini project 'Exploring Autumn'. This project teaches children about the natural changes that happen during the season of autumn, including how the weather changes, why trees lose their leaves and how wild animals prepare for winter. We will be reading 'Leaf Man' – Lois Ehert, we will begin to observe and talk about living things in the local environment.

Supporting your child at home

- -Make an autumn colour collage.
- -Draw a firework picture, name the colours that you see.
- -Look at pictures from the last holiday, look at the difference you can see in the weather, what we are wearing, what we are looking forward to.

Maths – We will be consolidating our learning from the last few weeks. Thinking about using our understanding of colours, shape, size and pattern.
