


### Preschool Newsletter

Thank you for everyone who came to our Preschool Nativity. We are extremely proud of the children, some of whom had not even been on the new hall stage prior to Tuesday and so it was fabulous for all children to be confident and entertaining.

**Topic:** Next week we will start our mini topic '**Sparkle and Shine**' This project teaches children about the celebrations that take place during the winter season, and focuses on the significance and symbolism of light at this time of year. Next week we will start talking about different times we meet up with family to celebrate, particularly Christmas. We will be thinking about different ways light is used to make the celebration special.

#### Our focus text will be



#### Supporting your child at home

Explore different pictures of family celebrations e.g. birthdays, weddings, firework parties and Christmas. Think about the how lights are part of celebrations e.g. Candles, Christmas lights.

**Maths:** This week we will be consolidating our understanding of sorting objects into groups.

### Supporting your child at home

- Set up a place at the dinner table using a knife, fork, spoon, plate and cup. Encourage children to look at your example and then have a go at setting up the rest of the places. Do all of the table settings match? Is there anything they need to change?
- Provide children with a variety of buttons. Ask them to find sets of green, yellow and blue buttons. What other sets of buttons can they make?
- Go on an outdoor walk and encourage children to collect some outdoor treasures, such as acorns, conkers, leaves, pebbles and shells. Encourage children to match the items before trying to sort them into different sets.
