Have a fabulous break but don't forget to carry on practising phonics, counting and number recognition.

Topic: Next term we will start our new topic **Dangerous Dinosaurs**, we will find out about prehistoric animals that lived on Earth. We will learn facts about dinosaurs and discover how big some of these giant creatures were. We will learn about the difference between carnivores and herbivores. We will also explore the animals that lived after the dinosaurs and which modern-day animals have prehistoric relatives.

Supporting your child at home

- Visit the Natural History Museum.
- Fossil Dig: Bury plastic dinosaur toys in sand or playdough and have kids excavate them like Palaeontologist.
- Dinosaur Size Comparison: Use household items (string, boxes) to measure how big a dinosaur like Diplodocus or T-Rex would be next to your house or car

Maths: Next term we will be reciting numbers past 5. Know that the last number reached when counting a small set of objects tells you how many there are in total ('cardinal principle'). We will link numerals and amounts: for example, showing the right number of objects to match the numeral, up to 5. We will also be exploring comparisons between objects relating to size, length, weight and capacity.

Supporting your child at home

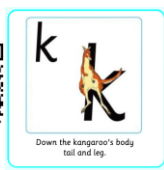
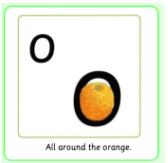
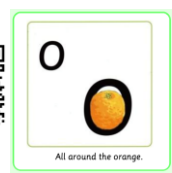
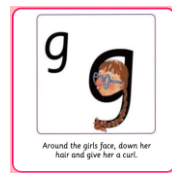
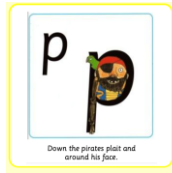
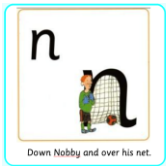
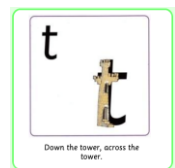
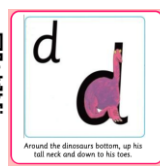
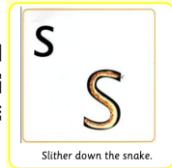
Nature's Rulers (Length/Size): Use natural items like sticks or leaves to compare the length of different objects in the garden. Use language like **longer**, **shorter**, **biggest**, and **smallest**.

Kitchen Capacity Challenge: Use different-sized cups, bowls, or spoons in the sink or bath time. Encourage your child to fill them with water and discuss which holds **more**, **less**, or is **full** or **empty**.

Weight Investigation: Use a simple balance scale (or even your hands) to compare the weight of different objects like a book and a toy. Introduce words such as **heavier** and **lighter**.

Father's Day EYFS Assembly – 19th June 2.15pm



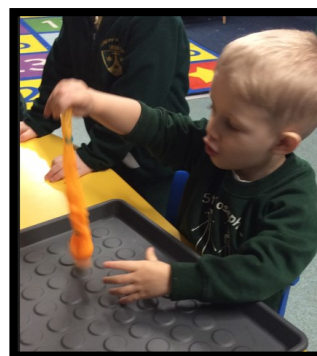
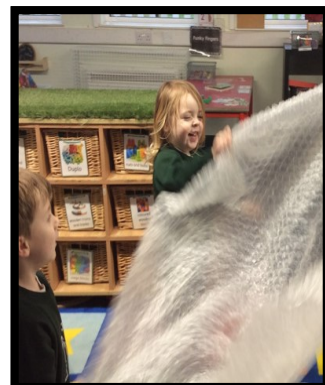

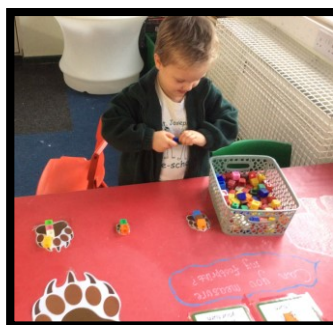
