Please explore the different phonics sounds to support your child's learning.






























Sound of the week







Maths – Next week we will be comparing groups – we will be able to look at two sets of objects and say which set has more. Comparing two small groups of up to five objects, saying when there are the same number of objects in each group, e.g. You've got two, I've got two. Same!

Supporting your child at home-

- -Go on a walk around your garden or an outside area. Collect some natural materials, such as leaves, pebbles, conkers or acorns. Sort the items into sets. Which set contains the most items?
- Gather a collection of socks. Sort them into sets based on colour, size or whether they have patterns on them. Can you find the set that contains the fewest socks? Can you sort the socks in a different way? Which set contains the fewest socks now?
