- Share and discuss the <u>Did you know?</u> Resource
- Read books about starting school
- Wear school uniform to come to Preschool
- Talk about changes in routine such as coming into school everyday in September.



Phonics – Over the half term, please continue to revisit the sounds that we have been learning. This will really support your child in preparation for Reception.
