What a wonderful few days it has been, all the children have grown so much over the holidays and it has been lovely to welcome new friends. We are looking forward to meeting more friends this week!

Topic: This term we will start our new topic 'Me and My Community'. This project supports children with settling into the new rules and routines of school and encourages them to make new friends and feel confident in their class. It teaches children about being helpful, kind and thoughtful at home and at school. This project also teaches children how they are unique and special, the importance of friendship and how people in their family, school and local community are important and can help them.

Supporting your child at home

Use some paint to make handprints of everyone's hands in your family and then cut out the handprints. Can you put them in order of size from the smallest handprint to the largest handprint? If you haven't got any paint, you could draw around hands instead!

Talk about how we are now part of the St Joseph's school community and how much fun it will be.

Talk to someone at home about what you would like to do when you grow up.

Maths – This week we will be looking at identifying colours. We will be looking at red, blue and yellow. We will be matching coloured objects with a visual colours. We will collect coloured objects of different shades and decide what colours they are.

Supporting your child at home

Children to find an object that is a specific colour and bring it into nursery to discuss.

Children can collect red/blue/yellow items around the house.

Hide and seek: Hide an object/toy that is red/blue/yellow. Children to find it.

Once they find it, they need to say, 'I found the red/blue/yellow toy!'

Discuss the colours on children's clothes. 'Oh, you're wearing red pyjamas today! What else do you have that's red/blue/yellow?




