Topic:

We will continue with our topic 'Starry Night'; This project explores the differences in the world at night compared to during the day. It teaches children about the importance of a good night's sleep, and helps them to discover what is happening in the world while they are sleeping, including finding out about nocturnal animals. Next week we carry on exploring 'How to Catch A Star' by Oliver Jeffers. We have stepped out the story, made story maps. This week we will be using our phonics to create a sentence.

Supporting your child at home

- Talk about what the children have learnt this week in class, ask the children to step out the story.**
- Ask your child to draw you a story map and explain the story.**

Maths – Next week in maths we will be exploring the numbers 6,7,8,

- Finding 6, 7 and 8 in the environment**
- Representing 6, 7 and 8 in different ways**
- Finding out how to solve number problems with one more and one less.**
- Looking at the composition of 6, 7 and 8**

Supporting your child at home

How to Set up a shop challenge

- With your child, count eight pennies into a small bag or purse.**
- Next, create a pretend toy shop. Gather a selection of toys and write price labels (6p, 7p or 8p) for them on small pieces of paper. All the toys in the shop should cost either six, seven or eight pence.**
- Once you have labelled the toys, invite your child to be the customer while you take on the role of the shopkeeper. Ask your child which toy they would like to buy and how much it costs.**
- Invite your child to count out the number of pennies needed to buy their chosen toy. Count the pennies together to check.**
- Then, swap roles. Choose a toy to buy from the shop and invite your child to count them to check you have given them the correct number of coins to buy the toy.**
