## **Reception Newsletter**

The children have had another great week of exploring, discovering and learning.

Our mini topic is 'Creep, Crawl and Wriggle'. In this project, your child will learn about minibeasts. They will observe minibeasts in their natural habitats and create shelters for them to live in. They will learn about the life cycle of a butterfly and explore what minibeasts need to survive.

Our key text for the last week is 'The Hungry Caterpillar'.

How you can support your child at home:

Go on safari to look for minibeasts that live in your garden or park.

- Make a bug hotel from plant pots, small rocks, stones, bark and leaves and see
  if minibeasts visit.
- Research some fantastic facts about minibeasts from around the world.

Maths- We will be revisiting and exploring shape in greater depth. How you can support your child at home:

#### **Maths Mastery Home Learning Challenge**

**Adult Guidance** 

#### What Are We Learning?

We are learning how to select, rotate and manipulate shapes.

#### How to Set Up the Challenge

- Begin by cutting some 2D shapes out of paper. Cut out a variety of circles, squares, triangles and rectangles of different sizes. Ensure that you have two of each shape.
- Then, arrange some of the shapes into a picture, such as a house, a boat, a castle or a rocket.
- Invite your child to use the shapes to copy your shape picture.
- Encourage your child to talk about what shapes they need to use and how they should be arranged.
- Explore how the shapes can be rotated, flipped and moved to create a matching shape picture.
- Then, invite your child to make a shape picture for you to

#### **How to Get Your Child Thinking**

- · What can you tell me about these shapes?
- How are these shapes the same? How are they different?
- · Can you use the shapes to copy my picture?
- · Where should this shape go?
- How can you make this shape look like the one in my picture?
- Can you make a shape picture for me to copy?
- Have I copied your picture correctly? How do you know?

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#### **Shape Pictures**



- With a grown-up, cut out some paper shapes.
- Watch carefully as your grown-up makes a picture using the shapes.
- What shapes do you need to use to copy their picture?
- · Where should the shapes go?
- · Do you need to turn or flip over any of the shapes?
- Can you make a shape picture for a grown-up to copu?

They have enjoyed exploring addition in Maths.














The children have been busy building a new home for monkey (from the book Monkey Puzzle, and have been doing lots of reading and digging.
