What an amazing week of learning, once again! The children have really enjoyed learning about animals, teen numbers and investigating in our outdoor area! They also have had great fun in the sunshine while taking part in Balanceability.

Our new topic is 'Animal Safari': -This project teaches children about the animals that live around the world, how to look after animals and the importance of caring for our local and alobal environments.

Our key text for the next two weeks is 'Monkey Puzzle'. How you can support your child at home:

- Look at the different animals and insects in the story. Go on a nature walk in your local park and see how many of them you can spot. Take photos of the creatures that you find which also appear in the story.
- Share some non-fiction books about Safari animals and write some fun facts.

Maths- We will continue to explore and investigate to the number 20 and beyond

How to support your child at home:

- Practise number formation (with particular focus on number 10 to 20)
- Continue to talk about and discuss 3-D shapes to embed learning.
- Encourage the children to use this game to make numbers between 10 and 20 and ask them to explain the addition sum.
