## Pupil Leadership message

This week on Monday we had a fantastic PSHE day. Reception and Years 1,2,3 and 4 learnt a lot about personal relationships and different ways to respect other people around us. In Year 5 and Year 6 we learnt about different types of abuse and particularly how drugs can affect our physical and mental health. Before we went home we all gathered in the hall to share what we did during the day with the rest of the school. This was led by Ms Burston, our PSHE leader. A few pupils were chosen to talk about what their year group had learnt. In assembly we saw the effects of smoking on your heart and lungs; your heart gets bigger and a black substance, called tar, develops on your lungs.

On Monday, Year 6 had a Year group Mass with their parents. Father John read and talked about the Gospel story, 'Jesus Heals a Paralysed Man' (Mark 2 :1-12).

Our favourite quotes were: "God is the only one who can forgive sins".
"My son your sins are forgiven".
On Thursday, 3D did their assembly on the theme of journeys. They told us about the journeys in our Catholic life. They talked about Mary and how she guides us all. At the end of the assembly, Mrs Lovegrove asked us who would guide us on our journey and the answers we gave were: God, Jesus, parents, siblings, the Holy Spirit and our Guardian Angels. We all loved the hymn they sang as it talked about one more step along the world we could go. Well done 3D!

## Punctuality

Being on time is a vital part of life and something we aim to instil in the children from the youngest age.
