

Collecting children at the end of the school day.

Please be reminded to make contact with the class teacher at the end of the school day when collecting your child. As you can appreciate, the children are excited and keen to rush off to their parents. However, the class teacher must be confident that the child has been released to the correct parent. If another adult is picking up your child they must have the password that you have provided. Our safeguarding assumes that if this adult has the password, you have given them permission to collect your child.

We remind you again that we will not release children to anyone under the age of 16.

School Information

Drop off in the morning

Just a reminder to please ensure that the children are ready to exit the cars on the turning circle. Adults should not be getting out of the car. It is vital that we keep the traffic moving on Priory Road and the surrounding area.

Please note that the main gate shuts at 8.50am—no cars should enter the grounds after this time. Please do not try to slip in as a car exits. If you arrive after this time you must park on the road and accompany your child to the school office to sign in.

If the school adults have left the turning circle—children must not enter the KS1 playground (as adults leave), as the main doors leading to the playground from the building are locked when we come in.

Collection in the evening

The school car park is not available for parking and collecting children at the end of the school day or from clubs. Please do not buzz the intercom and request entrance to the car park unless you are collecting from Busy Living.

Playground equipment

Reminder to all parents—the children and any siblings are not allowed to use any of the playground equipment on KS1 or KS2 play areas out of school time.

The children are not allowed on this equipment at the end of the day.

Please also be aware that the Forest School area should not be entered by the children out of school hours.

Please make sure that you keep your children with you at the end of the day. Thank you for working with us to ensure that the children are safe.

Water bottles

Please can you make sure that during the hot weather the children come to school with a named water bottle.

We have water dispensers in various areas of the school and the children will be able to refill their bottle at an appropriate time during the day. Please be reminded that the bottles should only contain water—juice is not permitted.

Earth Uniform

With the warmer weather this week there has been some huge variations in uniform. Please find below some important reminders and on the next page is the full uniform requirements for school—please can you remind yourselves of these, so that the children are wearing the correct St. Joseph's uniform. Teachers duties include monitoring uniform and they will speak to children and parents where uniform is not adhered to.

A few points to highlight:

- Children MUST have school shoes, trainers are not part of the uniform and should only be worn for PE lessons or Forest School.
- The school fleece is an outdoor jacket—it does not replace the school jumper.
- If children are wearing a shirt they should also wear a school tie.
- Pupils can wear a logoed school polo shirt or a plain polo shirt—Polo shirts no longer need to have the school logo.
- The option of a summer dress does not include culottes or gingham shorts and top set.
- Summer hats can be either a school caps available at Earth Uniform, or a plain green cap.

Please be reminded about acceptable hair cuts below:

On health and safety grounds, shoulder length hair and longer hair should be tied back neatly using bands in the school colours (white, dark green or black only). Large hair rosettes and bows are not to be worn.

Pupils should not wear extreme hair fashions, these include dyed or streaked hair, close shaved hair (even under top layer of longer hair - undercut) and styles such as spikes, tufts, high tops, flat tops, Mohican haircuts and images or lines cut into the hair.

Children's hair length should be no shorter than a number two.

The use of hair gels, waxes, oils, mousses and any other styling products is not allowed.

If we feel a hairstyle is unsuitable, we will ask for this to be rectified.


