

Headteacher Message

It has been an exceptionally busy and active week at St. Joseph's. There has been lots of additional experiences and special activities for the children to take part in to ensure that we give them a well rounded education.

All week the children have been getting active by taking part in additional sporting activities. Reception and Key Stage 1 had a special football session as well as having a trip to the theatre to see Zog. Key Stage 2 were transported to Hogwarts (the St. Joseph's field) for a thoroughly enjoyable game of quidditch. The week ended with Spanish Day today. Well done to the children in Year 6 who shared the Three Little Pigs story with Reception and Key Stage 1 children in Spanish during celebration assembly. The children in Key Stage 2 took part in a rotation of lessons learning about various aspects of Spain and the Spanish language. 
Reminder to Yr 5-6 parents
