4500BC	Sails began to be used on Egyptian ships for the first time. Boats were the main form of transport in ancient Egypt.	
3500BC	Craftsmen began to create the first wall paintings using hieroglyphics symbols in the Egyptian writing system.	
3000BC	Walled towns and villages were built in Egypt. The first buildings were made of mud brick.

2500BC Egyptians built the Great Sphinx and the Great Pyramid at Giza. 2500-2000BC was the 'Old Kingdom' period.

1325BC Around this time King Tutankhamun was buried in the Valley of the Kings. When the tomb was discovered in 1922, it was found intact and full of wonderful treasures as well as the mummy of the Pharaoh covered by a beautiful gold death mask.
