Introduction

It is our school policy that all children wear school uniform when attending school, representing the school, or when participating in a school-organised event outside normal school hours. All items of school uniform should be clean, neat, in good repair and should be labelled with the child's name.

Aims and objectives

We believe having a school uniform is important because it:

- promotes a sense of pride in the school
- engenders a sense of community and belonging towards the school
- identifies the children with the school
- promotes equality in terms of appearance
- is designed to be suitable wear for school

Our School Uniform

A complete school uniform list is attached in appendix 1. All items are mandatory except those indicated as being "optional" on this list.

Where to buy the School Uniform

Some items of our school uniform (e.g. items with the school crest) can be purchased from the approved school supplier. Please see the Appendix for ordering details.

All other items (e.g. shoes, trousers, skirts, pinafores, dresses, socks, trainers) can be purchased from any stockist.

Second-hand items of school uniform can be purchased from the Friends of St Joseph's School (FOSJS) second-hand shop. This is located in the terrapin hut at the 'drop off' zone. Please see your class representative or the school office for opening days and times.

We make every effort to ensure our school uniform is affordable and is good value for money. Any parent or guardian who cannot provide their child with items of school uniform for financial reasons should speak with the Headteacher.

Jewellery

On health and safety grounds, we do not allow children to wear jewellery in our school. The exceptions to this rule are plain ear studs in pierced ears, or a watch when your child is able to tell the time.

If a child wears any earrings, apart from studs, they will be asked to remove them. Staff cannot remove earrings for children. Please think carefully about this if your child asks to have their ears pierced. The school cannot accept responsibility for any jewellery that may be lost.

Footwear

All children should wear black shoes in school. Open toe sandals, trainers, boots and heels are not permitted.

Hair

On health and safety grounds, shoulder length hair and longer should be tied back neatly, in the school colours (white, dark green or black only). Large hair rosettes and bows are not to be worn. Pupils should not wear extreme hair fashions, these include dyed or streaked hair, close shaved hair (**even under top layer of longer hair**) and styles such as spikes, tufts, high tops, flat tops, Mohican haircuts and images or lines cut into the hair.

Children's hair length should be no shorter than a number two.

The use of hair gels, waxes, oils, mousses and any other styling products is not allowed.

If we feel a hairstyle is unsuitable, we will ask for this to be rectified.

Make up / Nails

Make up is not permitted.

Nails are to be kept short and nail varnish is not permitted.

The role of parents and guardians

We ask all parents and guardians who send their children to our school to support the School Uniform Policy and to ensure their child wears the school uniform and that it is clean, neat, in good repair and labelled with the child's name.

Requests to vary the uniform, to meet the needs of individual pupils (e.g. for medical or religious reasons) will be carefully considered and parents or guardians should speak to the Headteacher in confidence.

The role of the Headteacher

It is the Headteacher's responsibility to ensure the School Uniform Policy is implemented fairly and sensitively.

The role of the Governing Body

The Governing Body liaises with the Headteacher to ensure the School Uniform Policy is implemented fairly and sensitively.

It is the Governing Body's responsibility to ensure the school uniform meets all regulations concerning equal opportunities.

Monitoring and review

The Governing Body monitors and reviews the School Uniform Policy by:

- Seeking the views of parents and guardians, to ensure that they agree with and support the School Uniform Policy
- Considering, with the Headteacher, any requests from parents or guardians to change the School Uniform Policy
- Considering, with the Headteacher, any requests from parents or guardians for individual children to have special dispensation with regard to school uniform
- Asking the Headteacher to report to the Governing Body on the way the School Uniform Policy is implemented.

Parental Support Expectations

In accepting an offer of a place and in sending your child to St Joseph's Roman Catholic Primary School, you are agreeing to fully support school policies, procedures and high expectations.
