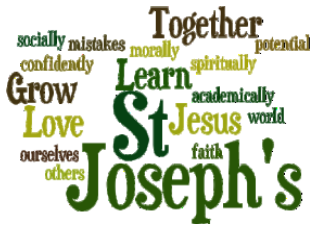

Headteacher Message

St Thomas Becket

This week, we celebrated the patron saint of our Trust, St Thomas Becket. He was the son of a wealthy London merchant and rose to become both the Archbishop of Canterbury and Chancellor to King Henry II, making him one of the most powerful figures in the country and the leader of the Catholic Church in England.

At first, many people doubted that Thomas could become a great church leader because of his luxurious lifestyle and love of fine things. However, he soon proved them wrong. He welcomed the poor into his home, offering them food and money. He gave up his rich clothing for simple monks' robes and even chose to sleep on the stone floor rather than in his bed.

Over time, Thomas Becket underwent a remarkable transformation. He often chose to defend the rights of the Church, even when it meant disagreeing with the King. King Henry II grew increasingly unhappy with Becket's new sense of duty and eventually accused him of theft.

Thomas denied the accusation and even offered to repay the money, but the King refused. As tensions rose, Becket fled to France. When he eventually returned to England, Henry continued to speak against him. On 29th December 1170, four knights, believing they were acting on the King's wishes, attacked and murdered Thomas Becket in Canterbury Cathedral.

The Christian world was shocked. In 1173, the Pope declared Thomas Becket a saint. Today, many people make a pilgrimage to Canterbury Cathedral, honouring St Thomas Becket as a martyr—someone who was willing to die for his beliefs.

As the patron saint of our Trust, we look to Thomas Becket as an example: to stand up for what is right, to remain true to our beliefs, and to care for others.

Please take a moment to speak with your child about their day on Thursday and the activities they took part in to learn more about this inspiring man.



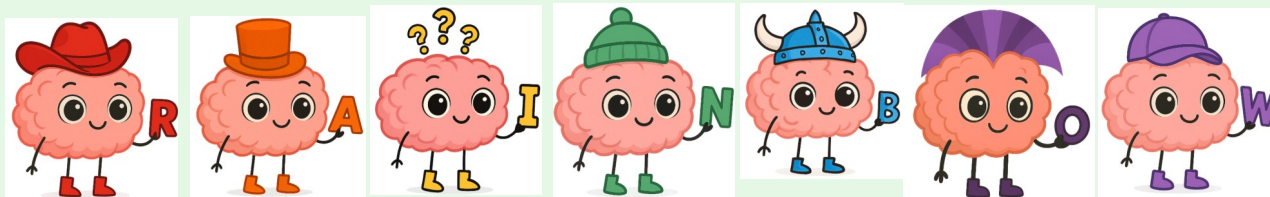

EMMA CARROLL

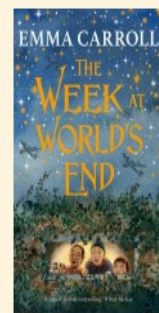
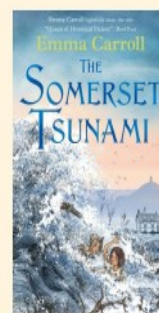
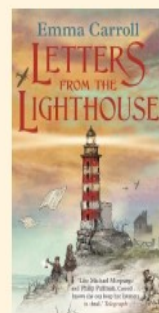


Her book, 'The Girl Who Walked on Air' was nominated for the Carnegie Medal award.
