



PARENT PACT

Want to wait to give your child a smartphone but don't want them to be the odd one out?

*You're not alone! There's a growing movement of parents in Buckinghamshire (and across Britain) who are choosing to wait to give their children smartphones. The Parent Pact is a way to join together with other families at St. Joseph's to agree to delay getting your child a smartphone until at least 14.

It's all about strength in numbers – if your child knows that other kids in their class won't be getting a smartphone for a few years either, the peer pressure dissolves. It takes 30 seconds to sign the Parent Pact – and you can see how many other parents at your school have signed have signed on the live leaderboards.

SAFEGUARDING AT THE END OF THE DAY

A reminder that you can enter school via the KS1 playground and the KS2 side gate in the afternoon. If you are only collecting from KS2 (Years 3-6) please use the side gate.

Please do not go around to the KS2 playground (if you have entered via KS1) until 3.30pm. We need to safely move all of the children to the KS2 playground to be picked up and this becomes complicated for the teachers and children if there are adults in the middle of this process.

We kindly ask that you leave the school, if you are on the KS2 playground, by the KS2 gate side gate —please do not come back via the marquees onto the KS1 playground.

A gentle reminder also, that there is no parking on the school site to collect children from clubs (exception of Busy Living). This has been in the newsletter for several weeks and there are still parents (particularly on Friday evenings) trying to drive onto the site.

PLEASE DO NOT DRIVE ONTO SITE DUE TO THE GATE OPENING FOR A DEPARTING VEHICLE.
