Headteacher Message

This Wednesday, 7th May 2025, marked the historic beginning of the Conclave, the process in which a new Pope is chosen in Rome. Following our discussions during last week's assembly, I am amazed by the interest shown by the children in this process. Many pupils have approached me to share that black smoke has been seen billowing from the Sistine Chapel—a sign that a new Pope had not yet been chosen. Choosing a new Pope is a challenging task and we were all amazed, I am sure, at the speed at which the new Pope was elected, yesterday. He has taken a new name, Pope Leo XIV, reminding us that Peter changed his birth name from Simon when he became a follower of Christ. This new name will mark the start of our new Pope's journey as the head of the Catholic Church.

Choosing a name can be a challenging task, one that all parents understand. It must be just right for this new person and hold significance in our lives. Perhaps you were named after a relative or a famous person. The new Pope will also have considered his new name very carefully, as this will set the tone for his papacy. A name makes you stand out from everyone else. It is used to identify you, and addressing someone by name shows respect, something each of us needs to feel validated in the world.

Feeling valued and developing a sense of self-worth is something we teach the children every day here at St. Joseph's. Our kindness wall emulates all the kind words and actions our pupils display to show love and respect to others. The kind words I hear on the playground are a shining example to every adult who works in the school. My hope is that our children will continue to lead by example, ensuring that kind words bring happiness and peace to a world where tragedy and war often reign.

As I sit in my office writing this, I have just observed the white smoke exit the chimney above the Sistine Chapel. A new Pope has been chosen. I pray that the Cardinals have chosen wisely, selecting a new Pope who, like St. Peter, will lead the world with love. Congratulations and God bless you, Pope Leo XIV.
