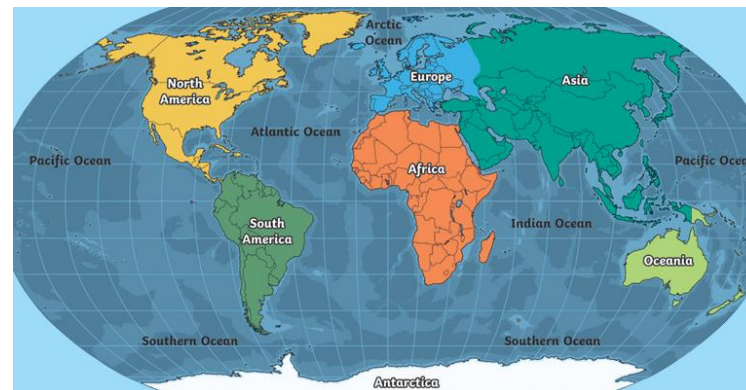
continents	Continents are the large areas of land on Earth that contain all the smaller countries.
