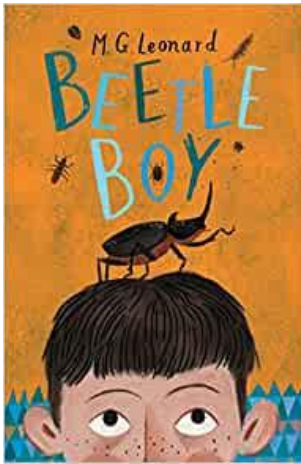

12:02am- The pod lands and the doors open. Everyone exits - everyone but Salim.

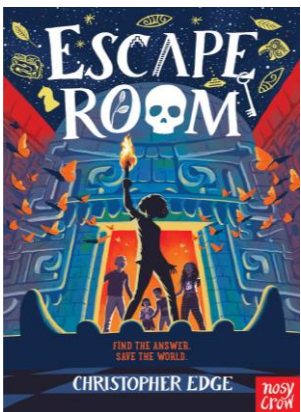
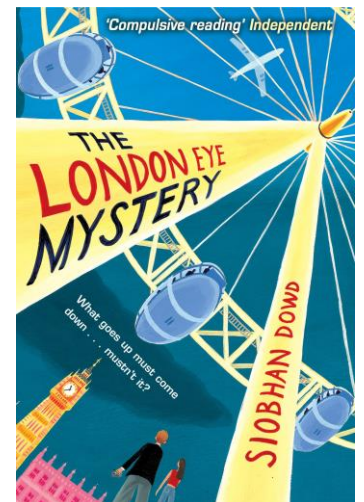
Has he spontaneously combusted? (Ted's theory.)
