Tony, lives in the local area and has a child at school - he is passionate about writing and this award is for someone who excels in writing.







Danylo and his family fled to Buckinghamshire from their native Kyiv in Ukraine in April 2022.


Despite the challenges you face, leaving everything familiar to yourself you have had some wonderful achievements and experiences – shown compassion and care for others.


